TO THE JUDGES OF THE COURT OF COMMON PLEAS OF Atlantic County.

The Petition of *Christian Heuber* respectfully sheweth:—
a Native of *Germany*

That your Petitioner arrived in the United States of America in the year 1854 and that in pursuance of an Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to establish an uniform Rule of Naturalization, and to repeal the Acts heretofore passed on that subject," made a declaration of his intention to become a citizen, conformably to said Act, *before the Clerk of District of Ohio September 19th 1856*

a certificate whereof is hereunto annexed; and that he has resided within the limits, and under the jurisdiction of the United States for five years last past, without being at any time during the said five years out of the Territory of the United States; and has resided for one year last past within the State of New Jersey; that he has never borne any hereditary title, or been of any orders of Nobility in the Kingdom whence he comes, or elsewhere. He therefore prays he may be admitted to become a citizen of these United States.

Philip Bergmann a citizen of the United States, being duly sworn according to law, says that he is well acquainted with the above named petitioner; and that to his knowledge and belief, he has resided within the limits, and under the jurisdiction of the United States for five years last past; and for one year last past, within the State of New Jersey; and has not at any time during the said five years been out of the territory of the United States: that during the same period he has behaved himself as a man of good moral character, attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same.

in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty six
Christian Steuber an alien and native of
Saxe Weimar Eisen personally appeared before me: **FREDERICK**
W. GREEN, Clerk of the District Court of the United States for the Northern
District of Ohio, and declared on his solemn oath, that he first arrived in the United States
in the month of July (3^d) A. D. 1854 and that it is his bona fide
intention to become a citizen of the United States, and to renounce forever all allegiance
and fidelity to every Foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty whatsoever, and
particularly to Charles Alexander Duke of Saxe Weimar Eisen
of whom he is a subject: and subscribed his
name to said declaration, which remains of record in my office.

and affixed the Seal of the said District Court, at the
City of Cleveland, this Nineteenth day of
September A. D. 1856 and in the
Eighty first year of the Independence of the
United States of America.
