with this day produced to me a recommendation from the  
Court of Common Pleas of the County of Atlantic

bearing date of the term of April

at One thousand eight hundred and fifteen

certifying that in their opinion the said Henry Myers, is of good  
repute for honesty, and that he intends to travel on foot  
for the purpose of exercising the business and calling of a hawker, pedler  
petty Chapman, or itinerant auctionar, and recommending him for that purpose,  
know ye, that I do hereby, in conformity with such  
recommendation, and with the provisions of an act of the Senate and  
General Assembly of the State of New Jersey, entitled An act relating  
to hawkers, pedlers, and petty Chapman, and to repeal the former  
acts on that subject, and the supplement thereto, license the said  
Henry Myers to follow, use and exercise, within this State,  
for the term of one year, from the date hereof, the business  
and calling of a hawker, pedler, petty Chapman, or itinerant  
auctionar travelling on foot
