To all to whom these Presents shall come greeting:

Whereas Henry Myers,

hath this day produced to me a recommendation from the Court of Common Pleas of the County of Atlantic bearing date of the term of April

A. D. one thousand eight hundred and fifty seven certifying that in their opinion the said Henry Myers is of good repute for honesty; and that he intends to travel on foot for the purpose of exercising the business and calling of a hawker, pedler, petty chapman, or itinerant auctioneer, and recommending him for that purpose: Now know ye, that I do hereby, in conformity with such recommendation, and with the provisions of an act of the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey, entitled "An act relating to hawkers, pedlers, and petty chapmen, and to repeal the former acts on that subject," and the supplement thereto, license the said Henry Myers to follow, use and exercise, within this State, for the term of one year, from the date hereof, the business and calling of a hawker, pedler, petty chapman, or itinerant auctioneer travelling on foot.

In testimony Whereof, the Great Seal of the State is hereunto affixed. Witness, William A. Newell, Governor of the State of New Jersey, this twenty first day of April, in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty seven and of the Independence of the United States the eighty third.
