PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

In the matter of the petition of Fredrick John Hubner to be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.

The petition of Fredrick John Hubner respectfully shows:

First. My full name is Fredrick John Hubner

Second. My place of residence is number 2521 Atlantic Ave street, city of Atlantic City

State of New Jersey

Third. My occupation is Butcher

Fourth. I was born on the 29 day of Oct, anno Domini 1876, at Juffenhausen Germany

Fifth. I emigrated to the United States from Southampton England, on or about the 27 day of Sept

anno Domini 1892, and arrived at the port of New York City, in the United States, on the vessel St Paul

Sixth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 19 day of Sept, anno Domini 1908

at Marp Landing N.J. in the Leon Place Court of Atlantic Co

Seventh. I am married. My wife's name is Adelen Hubner She was born

in Charlottenburg Germany and now resides at Atlantic City N.J. I have no children,

and the names, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:

Eighth. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to William II German Emperor of which at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Ninth. I am able to speak the English language.

Tenth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for a term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 5 day of Oct, anno Domini 1892, and in the State of New Jersey for one year at least next preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 6 day of June, anno Domini 1902.

Eleventh. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. I made petition for citizenship to the Court of Atlantic County at Atlantic City on the 5 day of Oct, anno Domini 1902, and the

said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit: and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition is my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Commerce and Labor required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.
