The petition of Friedrick William Gek respectfully shows:
First. My full name is Friedrick William Gek
Second. My place of residence is number 6 Belburn Hotel street, city of Atlantic City
New Jersey
Third. My occupation is Chef
Fourth. I was born on the 27 day of April, anno Domini 1870, at Achern Germany
Fifth. I emigrated to the United States from Havre France on or about the 1st day of March
Domini 1890, and arrived at the port of New York City, N.Y. on the vessel Champagne
Sixth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 15th day of March, anno Domini 1909
Mass Landing, N.J. in the Common Pleas Court of Atlantic Co
Seventh. I am not married. My wife's name is None and now resides at None I have no children.

the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children to as follows:

Eighth. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to be a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to William II German Emperor of which at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Ninth. I am able to speak the English language.

Tenth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for a term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since 11 day of Mar, anno Domini 1890, and in the State of New Jersey for one year at least next ending the date of this petition, to wit, since the 10th day of Feb, anno Domini 1902.

Eleventh. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. (I make petition for citizenship to the Court of Atlantic Co, and the petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit:

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition is my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Commerce and Labor required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.

OATH OF ALLEGIANCE

I hereby declare, on oath, that I absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to William II the German Emperor of which I have heretofore been a ^{citizen} ~~subject~~ (and that I further renounce the title of an order of nobility, which I have heretofore held); that I will support and defend the Constitution and laws of the United States of America against all enemies, foreign and domestic, and that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same.
