My full name is Anton MarkSecond. My place of residence is number new jersey street, city, town of Mullica TownshipThird. My occupation is farmerFourth. I was born on the 29 day of April, anno Domini 1869, at Bogar HungaryFifth. I emigrated to the United States from Antwerp Belgium, on or about the 25 day of Marchanno Domini 1904, and arrived at the port of New York City N.Y., in the United States, on the vessel DatherlandSixth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 13 day of March, anno Domini 1908at Mullica Township N.J., in the Common Pleas Court of Atlantic Co.Seventh. I am married. My wife's name is Regina Mark. She was bornHerest Hungary, and now resides in Mullica Township N.J. I have five children,the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows: Karl born March 10, 1895 at Buharest Roumania
Gregory born Oct. 1st, 1899 at Buharest Roumania, Rudolf born Sept. 11th, 1902 at Buharest Roumania
Willy born 1906 at Mullica Township N.J., Peter born March 27th, 1907 at Mullica Township N.J. All reside in Mullica Township N.J.Eighth. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to be a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Kaiser Joseph II Emperor of Austria & Apostolic King of Hungary of which at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Ninth. I am able to speak the English language.

Tenth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for a term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since

6th day of April, anno Domini 1904, and in the State of New Jersey for one year at least nextpreceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 6th day of April, anno Domini 1904.Eleventh. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. I made petition for citizenship to the Court ofat on the day of, anno Domini 1 and the

petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit,

I hereby declare, on oath, that I absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Francis Joseph the Emperor of Austria and Apostolic King of Hungary of which I have heretofore been a citizen (and that I further renounce the title of subject and that I further renounce the title of an order of nobility which I have heretofore held); that I will support and defend the Constitution and laws of the United States of America against all enemies, foreign and domestic, and that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same.
