Historical Note

HE Dutch congregation in Bergen is first mentioned in a letter by Governor Stuyvesant to the Directors of the Dutch West India Company, dated October 6, 1660. The Governor asks for preachers for the newly planted villages of about thirty families across the North River who are deprived "Necessity therefore requires that two of religious service. pious and learned candidates be sent over." A subscription for the support of a minister in Bergen is on file in the Archives in Albany, dated 1662. The minister, however, did not arrive. Documentary evidence shows that Englebert Steenhuysen began his service as voorleser and school master some time during the early part of the same year. The first list of members of the Church, a photograph of which appears on the next page, is dated 1664. It is evidently a copy from an earlier document. After Steenhuysen resigned the following voorlesers served the Church:

From 1667 to 1707, Reynier Van Giesen. From 1708 to 1736, Adrian Vermeulen.

From 1736 to 1761, P. Benthuyzen, who was succeeded

by the last voorleser, Abraham Sickels.

Peter DeWint was on the ground in 1750 preaching to the satisfaction of the people, both on Sundays and Wednesdays, but there was a flaw in the regularity of his ordination and he was compelled to retire. In 1753 William Jackson, a theological student, was called to be pastor, jointly, of Bergen and Staten Island. He sailed for Holland to study in the University of Utrecht and returned after an absence of four years, having meanwhile been ordained by the Classis of Amsterdam. On May 26, 1793, the Rev. John Cornelison became the second pastor of the Church and continued in office until his death in 1828. In the same year the Rev. Benjamin C. Taylor, D.D., began his long and faithful service of fifty-four years. Until 1871 he continued in the active pastorate, when his infirmities compelled him to retire. He was made pastor emeritus and continued to reside in the neighborhood until 1881, when he was translated. The Rev. James L. Amerman, D.D., was installed a few months after the retirement of Dr. Taylor. In 1876 he was appointed Professor of Theology in the seminary at Tokio, Japan. His college classmate, the Rev. Cornelius Brett, D. D., succeeded him in August, 1876, and still continues in the pastorate. For more than two years the Rev. William V. D. Strong served as assistant pastor. In January, 1908, the Rev. John J. Moment was installed as associate pastor and still continues in the service.
