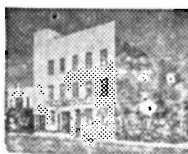

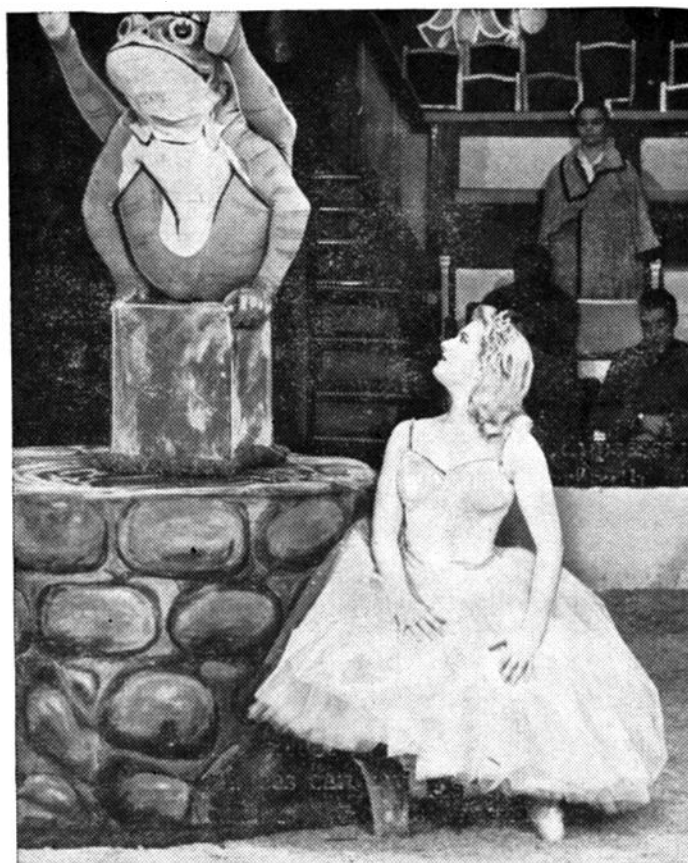

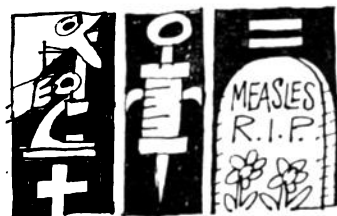

Biff tells a love story

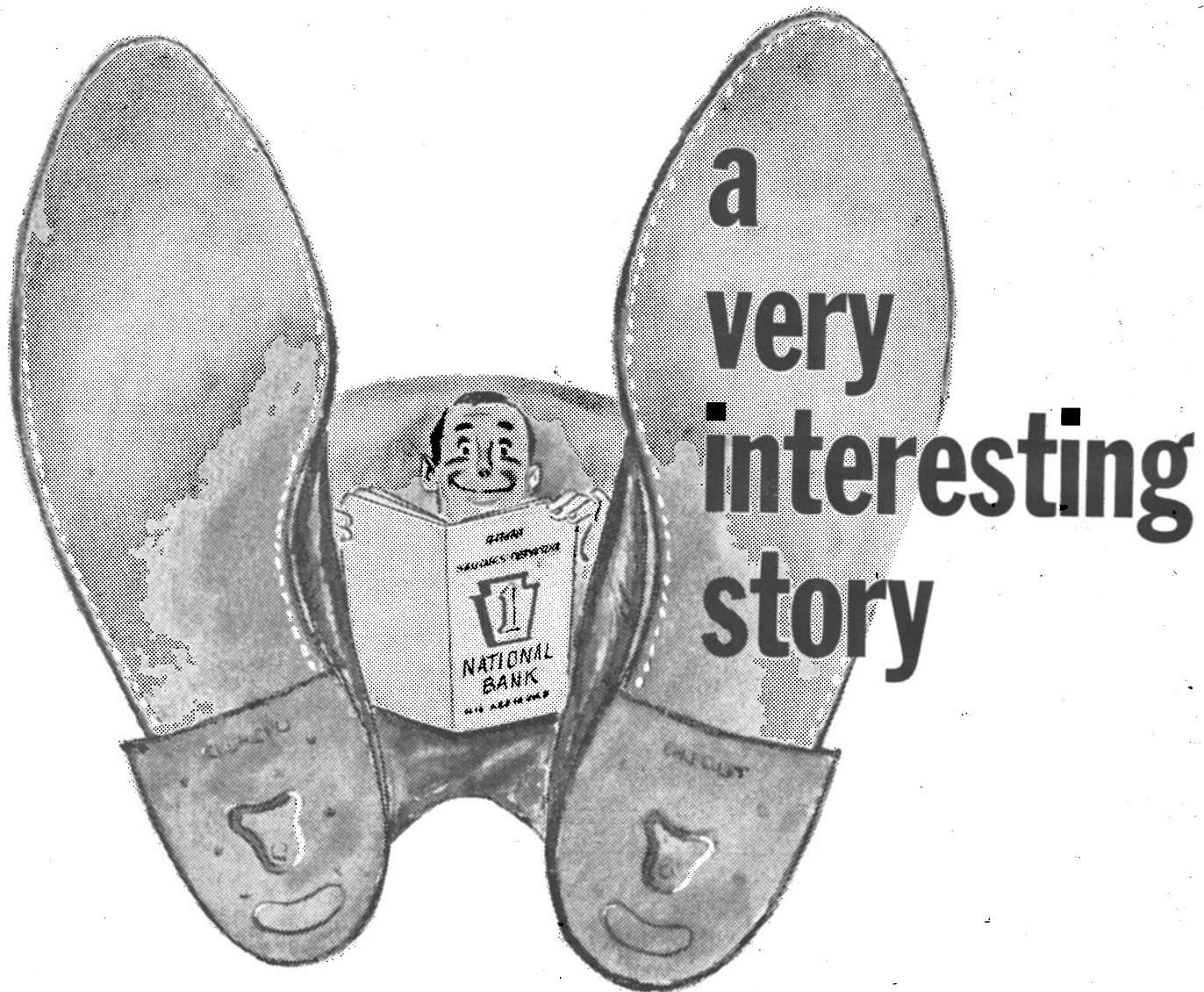
