

JIM McGreevey & Asian Americans

Jim McGreevey, the Democratic candidate for Governor of New Jersey, is Mayor of Woodbridge Township and a N.J. State Senator, representing the 19th Legislative District (Middlesex County). - Jim McGreevey has fought to combat bias crimes against Asians and other minorities. While serving in the State assembly, Jim McGreevey co-sponsored the Ethnic Intimidation Act. The legislation paved the way for tougher penalties for those convicted of ethnically motivated intimidation.
- Under the direction of Mayor McGreevey, Woodbridge can boast 711 minority owned businesses. As of 1992, there were 436 Asians and Pacific Islander who owned businesses in Woodbridge.
- On August 16th, Mayor McGreevey hosted "A Commemoration of 50 Years of India's Independence."
 The program musical selections such as the Indian National Anthem and distinguished speakers including the Honorable Harsh K. Bhasin, Consul General of India.
- Senator McGreevey introduced legislation establishing the Commission on the Status of Minorities. This
 commission would study the status of social and economic opportunities available to minorities,
 recommending ways in which to enhance opportunities for Asian Americans and other minorities.
- Jim McGreevey's efforts have helped to improve the quality of life for Asians in New Jersey. He has
 gained increased funding to develop Affordable Housing, fostered the growth of small businesses. He
 helped to establish the Jobs for Housing and Economic Development Act and has also advocated
 increasing the minimum wage.
- McGreevey supports bilingual education in the classroom and bilingual ballots in the election booth. As
 Governor he will work to provide more bilingual teachers to our schools and will ensure that there are
 bilingual ballots so that all our citizens may fully participate in the elective process.
- As part of his commitment to lifetime learning, Jim has spoken out against the prohibitive tuition increases at our state schools. In 1991, he co-sponsored the College Loan Assisting State Students Act which has helped students from middle class families afford a higher education. He is also leading the fight for full day kindergarten, college tuition tax deductions and improved job training.
