

Certificate of Incorporation  
of  
"The Trustees of Temple Sholem of Plainfield."

To the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas of the County of Union:

We, Herman Schived, Victor L. Drelich of the Borough of North Plainfield, County of Somerset and State of New Jersey and William Newcorn, Max A. Tepper, Raphael Good, Sam Rothberg, Herbert Schuldenfrei, Emanuel Schloss and Harry Dreier all of City of Plainfield, County of Union and State of New Jersey, do certify that on the twelfth day of November, nineteen hundred and thirteen the congregation of "The Temple Sholem" a religious society of the nomination known as Reformed Hebrews, entitled to protection and the free use of their religion by the constitution and laws of this state, assembled at their house in 119 West Front Street, in the City of Plainfield, which is their usual place of meeting for public worship, for the purpose of electing trustees for the said congregation with a view to becoming incorporated according to law; and that at least ten days notice of the time and purpose of such assembling had previously been given by advertisement set up in open view at said place of meeting, the said time of assembling having been agreed upon by said congregation; and that said congregation when so assembled did then and there by a plurality of voices of such members of said congregation who regularly contribute to the support thereof over twenty<sup>th</sup> years of age, as were present elect us, the said Herman Schived, Victor L. Drelich, William Newcorn, Max A. Tepper, Raphael Good, Samuel Rothberg, Herbert Schuldenfrei, Harry Dreier and Emanuel Schloss, to be trustees of said congregation and did instruct us to take upon ourselves a name of incorporation and to certify the same under our hands and seals, and transmit the same to the clerk of the Court of Common Pleas of the County of Union, for record.

To the end that we, the said trustees, might be incorporated pursuant to the provisions of "Laws of

to incorporate trustees of religious societies, and the  
supplements and amendments thereof.

And we further certify that, pursuant to the said  
instructions, and the provisions of the said act, we have taken  
upon ourselves the name of "The Trustees of the Temple Sholom  
of Plainfield" for a name of incorporation under said act.
