same to him and his Heirs for Ever and — much
as in their power Consent and devise that the Lords
will think fit to Grant the same & Thereupon now
in open Court at the Request of the Homage and upon
the petition of the said John Harris the Lords by their
aforesaid Steward have Granted out of their Hands
and Delivered to the said John Harris His that
piece or parcel of the W — aforesaid Situate on
Turkham Green lying in front and in Breadth
towards the Highway 50 foot little more or less —

and Assignees for Ever To be holden of the Lords

Customs as the Customary Tenants of the said
Manor have been used and accustomed to do
and perform And he is thereupon admitted
Tenant Fealty Respited and give to the Lords
for a fine on appears and so forth.
