

STATEMENT OF HOM JIN FUNG, or HOM CHONG CHUN, made before Immigrant Inspector Lewis B. Reynolds at the WING LEE LAUNDRY, #126 Broadway, Bayonne, N. J., on this 5th day of February, 1926.

BY EXAMINING INSPECTOR TO ALIEN:

Q. You are advised that I am a U. S. Chinese and Immigrant Inspector and that I desire to take a sworn statement from you relative to your right to be and to remain in the United States. Do you understand? A. Yes.

Alien, being then first duly sworn, testified as follows:

- Q. What are your names?
A. HOM JIN FUNG is my marriage name. HOM CHONG CHUN is my given name. I have no other names.
Q. How old are you? A. 46.
Q. What is your wife's name?
A. JUNG SHE.
Q. Where is Jung She now?
A. In China, in the Sam Ah Hong Village, Hoy Ping District.
Q. Have you any children?
A. I have no children.
Q. For how long did you work as a seaman before coming to the United States?
A. I am not a seaman.
Q. When were you last in India?
A. About 15 years ago.
Q. When did you come to the United States the last time?
A. I can't remember.
Q. Where did you last enter the United States? A. At New York, N.Y.
Q. You were a seaman at the time of your last entry into this country?
A. Yes.
Q. Just what kind of work did you do on the vessel on which you last came to the United States?
A. Carpenter.
Q. For how long did you work as a carpenter on that ship?
A. Two or three years.
Q. When did you last enter the United States?
A. Six or seven years ago.
Q. Are you sure that your last entry into the United States occurred 6 or 7 years ago?
A. Yes.
Q. Where are your parents now?
A. Both living in the home village in China.
Q. Your father was never in the United States? A. No.
Q. Was your mother ever in the United States? A. No.
Q. Where were you born?
A. SAM AH HONG VILLAGE, HOY PING DISTRICT, CHINA.
Q. Who owns this Wing Lee Laundry?
A. It is mine.
