FINDINGS AND COMMENT

It appears from the foregoing:

- 1. that this applicant is of Chinese race and was born in China 9/25/56, and that both his parents were born in China.
- 2. that he entered the U.S. about 1870 and that he has made one visit to China of about 14 months, beginning about 15 years after his original entry.
- 3. That he has no relatives in the U.S.
- 4. that he was married in China and that his wife is now living in his native village with a grandson, and that he had one son whose present whereabouts he does not know.
- 5. that he has no money or other resources, is unable to support himself and is dependent on public and private charity for the greater part of his support.

RECOMMENDATION

In view of the foregoing, I recommend that he be removed to Woo Lung village, Hoy Ping District, Kwongtung Province, China, in accordance with the provisions of Section 23 of the Immigration Act of 2/5/17, as amended.
