November 1st marked the Ribbon-cutting of the Roseland Public Library and Community Center with a long-awaited and well-attended celebration, following years of library growth, community planning, library design, and on-schedule and within-budget construction, as well as a five-stage fund-raising campaign. The Library now has the pleasure of announcing the great success of the campaign, thanks to many, and the anticipated closing of the Building Fund, Janu-

ary 11, 1988. This means that those wishing to contribute to the Fund or to fulfill pledges —in order to be recorded as building supporters—need to take action now. The deadline has been extended through the second weekend of 1988 to allow greater flexibility with tax planning. All contributions to the Roseland Public Library Building Fund are tax deductible to the fullest extent provided by law.
