Before Honorable James M. Van Valen, Judge of the Court of Common Pleas for the County of Bergen and State of New Jersey.

In the matter of a petition for the formation of a Borough Government in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, to be known as "The Mayor and Council of the Borough of Riverside."

A duly sworn and verified petition was presented to the undersigned Judge of the Court of Common Pleas for the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, in conformity with the provisions of an act of the legislature of this state, approved April 5th, 1878, and the acts supplementary thereto, in relation to the formation of boroughs, and in relation to the formation of a borough government, to the effect that the petitioners, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Riverside, do hereby petition the undersigned Judge of the Court of Common Pleas for the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, to order a special election to be held at Bogert's Hall, River Edge, on Friday, the twenty ninth day of June, 1894, by virtue of the provisions of an act of the legislature of this state, entitled "An act for the formation of borough governments", approved April 5th, 1878, and the acts supplementary thereto, pursuant to an order of James M. Van Valen, Judge of the Court of Common Pleas of said County, dated June 18, 1894, a true copy whereof is hereto annexed, do hereby certify that copies of said order were set up and published as required by said act, to which was annexed a statement of the day and place when and where said original order was filed, and due notice of the time and place of said election was given according to law, all of which appears by affidavits hereto annexed, and that said election was held this day at the place designated in said order and conducted by us; we having first taken and subscribed an oath honestly and impartially to hold and conduct said election, and the ballots cast at said election having been by us canvassed, we do hereby certify that the following is a true statement of the result of said election. Notice of Election for Incorporation of the Borough of Riverside.

Before Honorable James M. Van Valen, President Judge of the Court of Common Pleas for the county of Bergen and state of New Jersey.

In the matter of a petition for the formation of a Borough Government in the township of Midland to be known as "The Mayor and Council of the Borough of Riverside," Order, &c.

A duly signed and verified petition praying that a special election be held at some convenient place within the territorial limits hereinafter described, in conformity with the provisions of an act of the legislature of the state of New Jersey, entitled "An act for the formation of Borough Governments," approved April 5, 1878, and the supplements thereto, to the end that the legal voters within said territorial limits may vote for or against the formation of a proposed borough to be known as "The Mayor and Council of the Borough of Riverside," having been presented to me, in which petition the proposed borough is bounded and described as follows:

"Beginning in the center of the Hackensack river at a point opposite the middle of Gates avenue; thence (1) westerly to and through the middle of Gates avenue to the middle of the road leading from New Milford to River Edge; thence (2) southerly through the middle of said last named road to a point opposite the middle of Midland avenue; thence (3) westerly to and through the middle of Midland avenue to a point where the first brook crosses said avenue; thence (4) southerly along the middle of said brook to the southerly line of Midland township; thence (5) continuing along the brook and said township line, easterly to the center of Hackensack river; thence (6) northerly along the center of said river to the place of beginning. Bounded northerly by the southerly line of the borough of Delford, easterly by the Hackensack river, southerly by the southerly line of Midland township and westerly by the center of said brook."

Now, therefore, I, James M. Van Valen, President Judge of the Court of Common Pleas of the County of Bergen aforesaid, having examined the foregoing petition and the affidavits annexed, by which it appears to my satisfaction that all the requirements of said act have been complied with, do hereby order that a special election be held, in conformity with the provisions of said act and the supplements thereto, at Bogert's Hall, River Edge, being a convenient place within the proposed borough, on Friday, the twenty-ninth day of June, A. D. 1894, to the end that the persons qualified to vote at such election may vote for or against the incorporation of a borough within the said prescribed territory to be known as "The Mayor and Council of the Borough of Riverside," in order that it may be decided by the votes of said electors whether the borough shall be formed; and I do hereby appoint James D. Holdrum clerk of said election, and Henry Lozier and Albert Z. Bogert inspectors thereof, said persons being legal voters and freeholders within the limits of said proposed borough.
