I have been continuously in the service since July 12, 1918.
I was honorably discharged from my Emergency commission November 29, 1920,
to accept Regular Army Commission November 30, 1920, as Captain-Chaplain to
date from July 1, 1920. At time of acceptance I was stationed at the Pre-
sidio of San Francisco. Later received orders to sail January 5, 1921 for
China for duty with the 15th Infantry, Tientsin, China, where I am now station-
tioned. The tour of foreign service is two years.
