Dear Silvers,

I got your service letter and as you seem to be in doubt as to the location of some of us I'll try to enlighten you.

The Adjutant General, so I heard, over read the order of Major Gen. Scott or McRea, or whoever is running the 78<sup>th</sup> Div. and as a result Briggs, Fisher, Graff, Howell, Jones, Regendahl, Thompson, and myself landed in Camp Meade Saturday evening. There may have been more of us from Camp Dix whom I didn't know. All those mentioned, except (Graff) are in the battery.

I've seen Allen, Beyer, Elmer, Lyons, Mucker, and Mory down here but I haven't run into the others as yet. The letter was slightly blurred when it came to the numerals after Moore's name. I couldn't quite make out whether it was 16 or 18. If it was meant for J. B. Moore '16, I know he isn't at camp. He left for Europe several weeks ago with a small detachment from (Headquarters' company, 308 F.A.)

You mentioned you didn't know what had happened to us, while we are wondering what is going to happen. They make no secret of it here that we are not the least bit welcome (I'm writing of just the men from Camp Dix) and that they are trying to get rid of us but they haven't succeeded so far.
