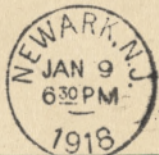
Dear Mrs. Axelly:

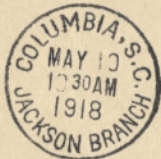

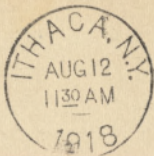
