My dear Miller:

I am afraid that I cannot give you much information in regard to the two points you mention in your letter of February 28th. I do not know where you should go to enlist in Naval Aviation but if you write to the commanding officer at Covernor's Island, I think you should receive the necessary information.

Concerning the next officer's training camp, nothing has yet been definitely settled. Possibly the college may be able to recommend a certain number of men as was the case in the last camp, and if this is so, we shall advise you as soon as any information comes to us. It is not possible to arrange for a special draft and transfer. The only way you can get into the training camp besides through the college is by enlisting in the Infantry or Field Artillery and being recommended by your company commander.

If there is anything that I can do in the way of recommending, I hope that you will call on me.
