Dear Mr. Sibers: -

We want to thank you and let you know that we receive the letter which the War Service Bureau, under your supervision, is sending to the men in the service. They keep us very much in touch with the doings at the college and with what is going on among the ^{other} men in the service.

We are out here in the wilds of Oklahoma in the photographic Division of the signal corps and do not see very many Outager men at

the aviation field. Lt. Harry Rockefeller and Lt. Herbert Leigh were at Fort Sill attending the school of arms and we had several pleasant visits. They both have returned to their former companies since. There is another Rutgers and New Brunswick man out here at present, Lt. Richard Smith. He is also attending the school of arms.

We would like to ask you whether or not it is possible for the military department to put thru a recommendation for us, which would aid us in getting into the next officers training camp, which we understand will open about June the first. We understand that each

getting into these camps. Our military
experience at the college was more than
long, but we will qualify, we are sure,
and anything you could do for us in
this respect would be greatly appreciated.

We were very glad to hear of such
a good basket ball team and the

would be appropriate for the college
war collection although we hope to
be across some day and in a
position to add to this collection.
