The Trafficking Victims Protection Act (TVPA) of 2000 is the first comprehensive federal law to address trafficking in persons. The law provides a three-pronged approach: (1) to identify and rescue victims of trafficking and prostitution; (2) to prosecute traffickers; and (3) to prevent trafficking. The TVPA was reauthorized through the Trafficking Victims Protection Reauthorization Act (TVPA) of 2005, 2008, 2013, and 2017.

A U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) report from 2014 states that human trafficking is a global phenomenon that affects all regions of the world. It is a modern-day slave trade that involves the recruitment, transport, and sale of people into situations of forced labor or sex trafficking.

FORCED LABOR is the recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision, or obtaining of a person for labor or services through the use of force, threat, or coercion, including debt bondage, for the purpose of subjugating the individual to labor or services, whether or not the individual has been transported, and whether or not the individual has crossed international borders.
