These figures concerning contributions are the totals for our whole church and all its organizations. They include the gifts through our church envelopes, the Woman's Guild, the Sunday School, the Christian Endeavor Society, etc.

We have no debt in any department of our Church and no unpaid bills. Our accounts on the above mentioned date were complete in every way. The trustees account showed a balance of \$197.33.

At the Congregational meeting the following budget for the year beginning April 1, 1939, as proposed by the trustees was adopted:

In our Missions and Benevolence account we have definite obligations as follows: Salary and pension of Warren S. Reeve \$1,575; Support of Italian Mission \$1,344; total \$2,919. In addition to this there is urgent need for contributions to the general work of our four Boards, the Belvidere Home, and other worthy agencies. Unfortunately in the past few years we have been able to meet only our definite obligations as mentioned above.

The anticipated contributions of the Guild, the Sunday School and the Christian Endeavor Society are entirely separate from the proposed budget. These contributions go to specific objectives which are well known to the members of these various organizations.

Our Italian Mission reports a Church membership of 84; a Sunday School membership of 56; and total contributions of \$222.80.
