Lieut. Florance Returns From Overseas Service

First Lieutenant Edwin Florance, of the 47th Coast Artillery, son of ex-Senator and Mrs. W. Edwin Florance, of Livingston avenue, has been honorably discharged from the service and will probably resume his studies in engineering at Columbia University.

Lieutenant Florance, who is a graduate of Rutgers College, 1916, returned from overseas duty three weeks ago. The young soldier entered the service at Fortress Monroe, Va., on August 19, 1917, and later was transferred to Fort Hancock, Sandy Hook, where he was stationed for over a year. From Fort Hancock he went to France with the 47th Regiment where he saw lots of active service, but fortunately escaped without a scratch. He returned to America three weeks ago on the Madawaska and was sent to Camp Eustis with the troops, from there to Camp Upton, thence to Camp Merritt and finally to Camp Dix where he received his discharge.
