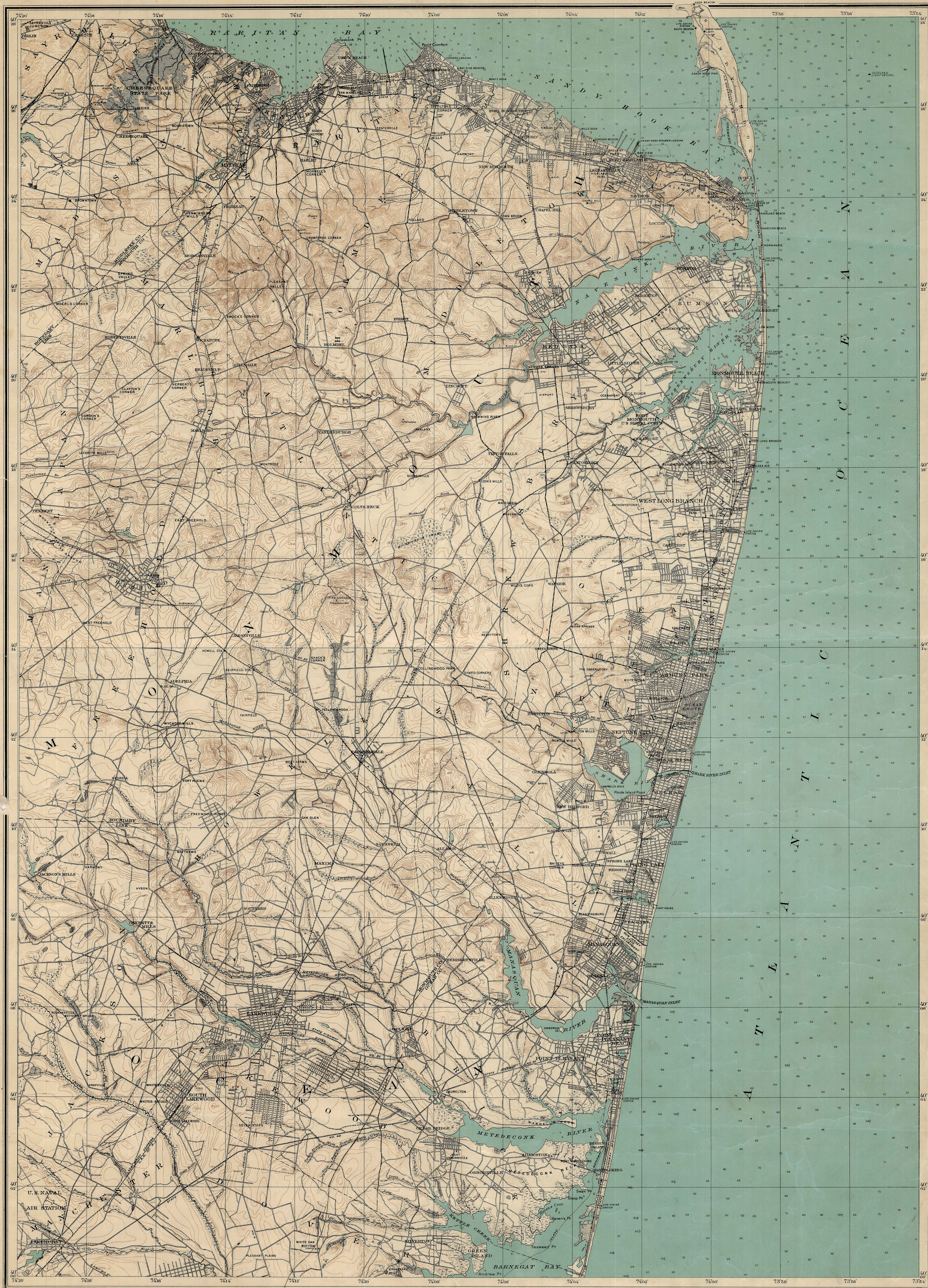

NOTE: The curved lines are level lines drawn on the earth's surface. All points through which any given line passes are at the same level and their height above mean sea level is shown by the figure on the line. The time of day from any time to the next is indicated by a small circle. Figures on the line show the depth of water at a point indicated by a small circle. Figures on blue ground indicate the depth of water at low tide.
